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

In the Library

The list of books and DVDs for the library has been updated. Vicky has emailed the information to those who have valid email addresses on file with ASG. It is in 3 different formats so everyone should be able to open at least one of them. We also have the list available in the library notebook. It has 3 different ways to look up books-by author, by title, and by subject. Hopefully this will help all of us locate books more quickly.

Also, we will no longer take patterns from McCalls, Vogue, Butterick or Simplicity. We have an over abundance of them so we are charging only 10 cents each for them. Those we cannot sell will be donated to a charity the first of July. We will continue to take patterns from specialty and independent pattern makers. We are also purging our "stash" of old magazines. These will be free to those who want them and will be available at the June meeting.

Items in our library include books, videos, DVDs, magazines and patterns. These items may be checked out for one month at a time. DVDs and videos must be returned the following month and may not be renewed until the end of the meeting so that others have a chance to check them out.

There is a charge of \$1 <u>per item per month</u> for items returned late. Any item not returned within 6 months will be considered lost and the member will be responsible for replacing it. A complete listing of library holdings is available at the library table during our monthly meetings.

We are also happy to receive your donations of sewing related magazines that we then sell to other members. However, we request that you limit your donations to no more than two years worth at one time, so that our librarian can handle the volume.

Unique Designs and New Life for Leather

Wichita, KS Chapter:

Marsha McClintock, National Sewing Educator and owner of Saf-T-Pockets patterns, presented an evening trunk show and a two day hands-on workshop for our members and guests.

The evening trunk show allowed us to see Marsha's beautiful garment and accessory designs in many variations and fabrics. The presentation was highlighted by her innovative demonstration on how to pack a week of clothes and accessories in a "carry-on" bag for air travel. We were amazed at her technique for keeping garments wrinkle-free and utilizing every inch of space in that bag.



The next day, we experimented with designing our own fabric details by using stamps, foil, silk screen and pleats. In addition to unique fabric designs, Marsha also showed us how to make and apply trims, unusual closures, in-seam buttonholes and fun pockets and sleeve treatments.

Our second day was all about leather. We started by learning the basics about types of leather, sewing supplies needed, patterns and cutting and marking techniques. We were ready to take our old leather coats or thrift store finds and turn them into fun accessories. She demonstrated how to use existing details such as pockets, buttons, zippers and decorative stitching in our new handbags, totes and coin purses. Although it was a little scary to make that first cut into a leather garment, we soon got into the spirit

of reusing leather and creating something new. By the end of the day, we had coin purses, tote bags and handbags in various stages of completion.



Dillons Community Rewards program

We have learned that we can register with the Dillons Community Rewards program and earn money for our chapter. Register your Dillons card and then each time it is swiped the chapter will receive a small rebate. This in no way impacts your Dillons gas points. It is merely a way for Dillons to give back to the communities where their customers shop.

Below are instructions for registering your card. Once registered, allow two weeks and then you should see a statement at the bottom of your receipt that indicates that you have affiliated your card so that the Wichita Chapter will receive your rebate. Please take a few minutes to do this! It's free money for us.

You can register on line at https://www.dillons.com/communityrewards To sign in or create an account to enroll:

- Click on Sign In/Register
- If you are a new online customer, click Create an account
- Sign up for a Dillons Rewards Account by entering zip code, clicking on favorite store, entering your email address and creating a password, agreeing to the terms and conditions. You will get a message to check your email inbox and click on the link within the body of the email.
- If you have an online account, click sign in and use your email address and password to proceed to the next step.
- Click on Edit Dillons Community Rewards information and input your Kroger Plus card number.
- Update or confirm your information.
- Enter Wichita American Sewing Guild, select organization from list and click on confirm.
- REMEMBER, purchases will not count for our group until after you register your cards.
- Do you use your phone number at the register? Call 800-576-4377, select option 4 to get your Dillons Plus card number
