

# Needled by Norma

Oh dear, this month has snuck up on me way too soon. I'm not ready for the holidays as I have yet to lose the weight I gained last year. I'm

thinking we should drop the tradition of eating humongous meals and high calorie party snacks and consider trading all that prep time for sewing time. I've read somewhere that sewing is much better for you than cooking. Here are just a few reasons:



#2 You can't ruin a sewing project by walking away from it. Food burns while you're on the phone, potatoes boil over when you turn your back, gravy thickens, casseroles stick to the pan (this doesn't say much about my cooking skills does it?) but you can walk away from a sewing project for a few minutes, a few days or a few years and then just pick it up where you left off.

#3 It won't make you fat. What kind of food can offer that benefit? You get exercise by moving from the machine to the iron, getting up from the sewing machine and walking over to the serger or cutting table, bending over to pick up the dropped pins, and on a good day, you can sew right through a meal and not even miss it. Plus, when you make it yourself, it's whatever size you say it is.

#4 You can't ruin it. It's hard to unsalt the stew, unburn the casserole or uncook the overdone roast. Sewing projects can be taken in or added to, dyed or bleached.

#5 Sewing is "user friendly". You have your own personal space where you are in your comfort zone. You have choices of making something small and quaint or elaborate and flashy, whatever your mood is at any given time. You can even sew barefoot in your pajamas and without makeup. Food easily becomes too spicy, too pricey, or too greasy. Restaurants are too dark, too crowded or even too loud.

#6 It's cheaper. You can easily spend \$25 on a steak dinner or that same \$25 will make you a nice pair of pants. This brings me back to reason #1.





### **January 2018 General Meeting Presentation.**

Sein Lengeju, MSW, CEO of Keep Girls Safe Foundation, and her daughter, Brillian, Miss Kansas Teen 2017-2018, will be sharing stories and pictures from last summer's visit with the Maasai tribe in Kenya, and relate progress with their project to empower, enlighten and motivate young girls and boys through education and choice to become agents of change, working to break the cycle of destructive cultural practices in Kenya, such as female genital mutilation and early forced "marriage." Brillian's focus in her role as Miss Kansas Teen, has been providing female hygiene items to Maasai girls so that they can continue to attend school throughout their cycles. She has also been working to ensure girls in poverty here, have greater access to necessary feminine hygiene items. We began our "Days for Girls kits" contribution to their effort this year by completing 30 DFG kits for their trip to Kenya. We made 30 kits, each one with one bag, 8 liners, and 2 shields per kit. We will be continuing this project in 2018 with a goal of another 30 kits to be completed by June 10<sup>th</sup>
