Sew Timely

...and a good time was had by all! Yes, I went to Kansas City in April to attend the Kenneth D. King classes for two days. Karin of the Kansas City chapter was kind enough to save a spot for me in the hands-on class that was immediately full the day they opened the registration. This class was about copying your favorite garment without taking it apart.

We learned that "un-sewing" a garment can distort the seam lines, resulting in an inaccurate copy. The second important idea was that copying a garment for your own use or to learn its construction methods is consid-

ered fair use under copyright law. This also includes copying a garment belonging to a client for the client's own use. This means that if your favorite pair of pants are worn out, or you find a vintage garment that's falling apart, you can make yourself a new one. You cannot, however, take the pattern you have copied from your garment, print copies and sell them on Etsy or at the local quilt shop.

The method used by Professor King is a variation of a "rub-off" that requires several steps and more detail than some methods I have seen. It works for garments with a lot of seams and/or style details. It depends on accurate marking of grain lines with thread tracing and seam lines with pins. Grain lines marked on a piece of organza are matched to those on the garment piece, and the seam lines are then traced with a colored pencil. There are methods for determining dart take-up, pleats, yokes, and sleeve caps on jackets, pants, and even knits.

After copying the garment sections to the organza, the seam lines are transferred to paper using a tracing wheel and dressmaker's carbon paper. The same method is used to transfer seam lines and cutting lines with ample seam allowances to muslin, which is sewn up. The fit is refined on the muslin and transferred back to the paper to produce a final pattern.

I have sewn up my muslin, except for the sleeves, and I hope to be able to demonstrate the method and show you the finished garment later this year.

Join the Party, Oct. 22nd!

We're planning our first, big Hospice Gown Sewing Party for Oct. 22nd! Inspiration came from Deb Zent, a hospice nurse and sewist in Kokomo, Indiana. As part of going into other people's homes on a daily basis, she became aware of how much her patients' loved ones/caregivers struggle to dress them and the energy it involves for the patients just to raise their arms to get their shirt or blouse over their heads. There are hospital gowns, but it's just another expense and a matter of going there and getting them besides being plain and institutional looking. So, Deb decided to make hospice gowns. The families she serves tell her that the gowns make a big difference for them and their loved ones, dressing and seeing their loved ones comfortable, fresh and clean and in a nice-looking gown. To see someone in a gown that has been kind of custommade for them, a "designer gown" has brought such joy!

Deb involved her whole family in making gowns but the need overwhelmed them, at two gowns per patient and there are a lot of patients in need. Thus sprang the idea for a "sewing party" to make more gowns. That's why Beryl chatted with Deb to learn more about her experiences with patient families and tips for holding a sewing party. She mentioned one lady, whose husband jumped at the idea of having a foxes-print gown for his "Foxy lady." Think of the joy in their hearts that came from receiving that gown. Another gentleman's wife was exhausted from dressing him in a dress shirt every day. It was so important to them that Deb made a modified collar and placket gown that looked great and gave them both relief and joy. Those little thoughtful sewing gestures made a difference! There were also a lot of tips about how to make our own sewing party fun and productive.

So here we are today, having delivered 38 beautiful gowns, in a variety of colors and prints, to Harry Hynes Memorial Hospice after just starting the Hospice Gown-making project in March! We're already customizing patterns, such as XL sizes, lowered necklines, bias facing, pockets, etc. They need a lot more gowns, though. Harry Hynes Memorial Hospice (HHMH) serves over 90 patients at home in Wichita area on any given day – at 2 gowns per person that adds up to 180 gowns. And patient enrollment never stops.

Sheila Shaw, the Director of Volunteers at HHMH, was so excited by Deb's video (see www.institcheswithdeb.com) and our first set of beautiful gowns that she brought in their CEO and Clinical Coordinator to brainstorm about how they could help us serve their patients and families. Now they are busy raising funds to help us purchase fabric. Sheila is an event expert and has offered to manage a lot of the arrangements for our sewing party (lunch donated and delivered, fun small prizes, and help with set up and take down/clean-up, as well as invitations to sewist hospice volunteers!) Given Sheila's expertise in event planning and execution, we can relax and use our expertise in sewing for a worthwhile cause, enjoy meeting other sewist volunteers, and just have a fun party! We already have a massage therapist volunteering her time!

We hope you'll join the party – R.S.V.P. Invitations go out soon after Labor Day and we'll have final patterns and instructions out to participants later that month!

Linda will show us her step by step imaginative process to transform details from ordinary and practical to exotic accent pieces that can enhance and convert fabric into sewing magic worthy of boutiques worldwide. The trunk show will be a delightful trip through Linda's creations.

Friday, October 7, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Lecture and Hands on "Spiraling Patchwork" and "Creating Texture Textiles"

Linda will guide us through sewing fabric strips together, and then cutting them up to create spiral patchwork. Our "new" fabric could be used in a handbag, garment or table runner. The next adventure will be creating tone on tone fabric with texture using thread, cords, etc. We will need to dig out those sewing machine feet we rarely use and watch the magic happen.

Saturday, October 8, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Lecture and Hands on "Creating a Designer Handbag"

Join us as Linda teaches the techniques of different zipper uses and applications, snap closures, and how to make the strap for the handbag. We will construct the handbag using the "Spiraling" fabric and "textured fabric we made the previous day, adding pockets inside and out, zippers, and lining the purse.
