In the printers world its width in which a column or page of printed matter is



Measurement is taken so seriously that the US Government had a Weights and Measures Division within the National Institute of Standards and Technology. Look at how many tools we own in our sewing room for that one task. Measuring tapes, 6" gauges, French curves, cutting mats, that little scale on the front of most sewing machines, ironing boards with 1" grids printed on the cover, hem markers, seam gauge, not to mention the multitude of clear acrylic quilters squares and rectangles. Can you imagine how hard it would be to sew up a garment if we had no measurements to guide us. I guess you could even call a pattern a type of measure because it keeps all the cutting lines uniform, so we can produce the same item twice. As if that weren't confusing enough, how do you make sense of our use of measurements? The English language gets everything all twisted up. How long is an inchworm? If I'm within an inch of losing it, how close am I really? And if it's within an inch how can it be lost? Is everyone's foot 12" long? When you gaze over at the foothills, what will you see? Why is it that writing notes on your hands is considered cheating, but when you document it with footnotes it's OK. If I'm footloose and fancy free does that mean more than 12 inches with no embellishment? Are all the sticks in my yard considered yardsticks? If I were to go to make a yard sale purchase, would I be buying 3 feet?

Now that I've got that out of my system, I want to see how many of you will be able to MEASURE UP this year. Since our new meeting location move, we are looking for different venues for our 5<sup>th</sup> Tuesday sew-ins and the CAB would be interested in your input. If you do not have computer access, please ask one of us for help. The winner will be drawn at random for a prize at the ASG conference in July. The chapter with the highest percentage of participation will be awarded a free education event to be held within the following 10 months. You are allowed multiple entries as long as they are different projects (you cannot make 5 hot pads but can make a purse, cap, checkbook cover, apron and pin cushion). There is no good reason why a chapter cannot have 110% participation. Now the fun part for our challenge is that once you submit to national, they will send you a receipt acknowledging your entry and we will use those for entries to our own drawing (multiples are allowed) for a sewing machine light being donated by Betty Brees.

Entries have already started coming in. I know that there will be many others as the deadline approaches. To comply with the many requests we have received, the **deadline for submissions has been extended to May 31, 2018.** Yes, you now have an additional two months to work on your fabulous entries.

### Can one member submit more than one item?

Yes, as long as the items are different in terms of patterns. For example: one member can submit a handbag, a dress and a wall hanging. As a result, the chapter will be credited three entries.

#### | Do I have to use the gray and white version of the design?

No you can use any of the color palettes offered and in any size on any fabric.

### I can't seem to find a place to enter the discount code, ASG20.

To find the space to enter ASG20, first pick the fabric and put it in your cart. Scroll down, just below the listing of fabrics look on the left to enter the discount code

### Can I use more of the coordinating fabric design than the winning design?

Yes. The rule is that the winning design made with the dress form and the ASG logo (in any color palette and size) must be featured in the project.


### Can I use the winning design solely as a lining in a project?

No, using it this way does not feature the design. It must be visible from the exterior of the item.

### How will you know how to credit my chapter for my entry?

After your creation is completed, you will need to submit your name, your chapter name, and a photo of your creation making sure that the winning design is clearly displayed to <a href="mailto:assfabricdesigncontest@gmail.com">assfabricdesigncontest@gmail.com</a> no later than May 31, 2018.

Now with this information, I just know that your scissors will be clipping and your machines humming to make wonderful creations as contest entries. We can't wait to see what you create.



# i On-Going Fundraisers


