

Tips on Needles and Thread from Pfaff Consultant Becky Gilbert

Here are some of the invaluable tips which Pfaff Consultant Becky Gilbert shared at a seminar this year in Kansas City.

THREADS:

Thread has a memory. In order to thread your machine and not have a breakage problem - especially with metallic or speciality threads -- you need to thread your machine correctly. To find out how the spool of thread needs to be placed on your machine you need to use "virgin" thread. Virgin thread is thread that has never come off the spool. Hold the spool in your right hand, horizontally, with the loose thread end in your left hand. Draw off about one yard of thread and bring the loose end to the spool. If the thread that is in the loop in front of you twists, then you need to turn the spool end for end. Cut off the loop of thread and repeat. The new loop of thread should not twist and therefore will not break in your machine, just thread it that way on your machine. At least 80% of all thread will come off from the back, but not all, so check your thread and you will have little or no problems. This was how Gilbert tamed all of her metallic threads on contest pieces for the PFAFF competitions.

If you are having problems with Thread Tornados or

Slinkys just above the eye of your needle, you need to go to a larger eye in your needle. Thread Tornados or Slinkys are caused by friction on the thread. Becky's favorite needle is a medafil #80 due to the large eye which accommodates these threads. A top stitching needle will also work well due to its larger eye. Gilbert prefers to have all her threads come off the spool horizontally, but realizes that sometimes that is not possible. She does insist that the new flat thread must be placed horizontally. If it is not, it will not give the dimension that it was designed to.

Another thing to consider is that if you are using a metallic thread you need to use a cotton bobbin. Polyester or polyester/cotton blends in the bobbin will cut the thread on top, sometimes immediately, and sometimes through wear of the product. Gilbert also suggests that if you are going to use Monofilament thread on the bobbin to wind the bobbin at an even, constant speed. This monofilament thread will stretch, therefore you do not want to wind it too fast. Also, you only want to wind the bobbin one-half full. If you do fill it full, you may not be able to get the bobbin off of your machine. It will tighten the center of the bobbin. Gilbert remember having a bobbin explode inside the bobbin case while she was stitching — what a mess. She challenged everyone to try Cotty Thread when embroidering or top stitching. She showed a piece of embroidery that looked as if it was done by "HAND" due to the texture of this thread.

NEEDLES:

Gilbert believes you need to use the smallest needle possible to get the job done. She said that it is much easier to put a needle into multiple layers of denim than to try to use a roofing nail, so think about it — smaller needles will go into fabric much easier, and look better in the long run. Twin Needles also come as Medifil needles ranging from 1.4 to 8.5 spacing in between the needles and a full range of sizes for the needle (i.e. 8's, 10's, 12's, etc.) So if you are using metallic thread and want to use a twin needle, they are out there.

Gilbert also brought four of the contest winners from the PFAFF design challenge and showed how each was made. Malynda says that she really enjoyed the conference and Becky's inspirations at trying new things or old things with a new twist. Everyone had a good time while learning new things that their machine (whether PFAFF or not) could do if only they pushed the envelope a little and experimented.

1 (12 oz.) pkg butterscotch morsels

1/3 c. margarine

2 c. graham cracker crumbs

1 c. chopped walnuts

1 (8 oz.) pkg cream cheese

1 (14 oz.) can sweetened condensed milk

1 tsp. vanilla

1 egg

In medium saucepan, melt morsels and margarine. stir in crumbs and nuts. Press half the mixture firmly onto bottom of a 9" x 13" baking pan. In large mixer bowl, beat cream cheese until fluffy. Beat in condensed milk, vanilla and egg. Mix well. Pour into prepared pan. Top with remaining crumb mixture. Bake 25 to 30 minutes or until a tooth pick inserted near center comes out clean. Cool before cutting into bars. Refrigerate leftovers

How to be Stable in an Unstable World

Six Main Functions of Stabilizers

from National Convention by Sulky of America

- Stabilize fabric and supplement fabric weaknesses.
- (2) Stabilize and improve appearance of embroidery and decorative stitching.
- (3) Minimize adverse affect of push pull. (As the design is sewn fabric will either be pulled in (satin stitch) or pushed up (pucker; happens most often in digitizing).
- (4) Maintains the resolution of the embroidery (embroidery with a backing tends to look crisper and neater).
- (5) Extends the launderablilty of the garment.
- (6) Eases the ability to un-embroider (rip out).

Tips:

There are four categories of stabilizers: Wash away type; Tear away type; Burn away type; and Cut away type.

Most professional embroiderers prefer cut away stabilizers, because they stand up to all the needle penetrations better than tear aways do. "Cut aways" also reduce the amount of shrinkage of the design — but not of the fabric.

When using two layers of the same stabilizer, turn them in opposite directions for extra strength.

Stitch-intense designs should **not** be placed on light weight fabrics.

CREATIVE PIECING FOR QUILTED CLOTHING

from National Convention by Mary Ray, Associate Editor, Threads Magazine

Pieced and quilted garments don't have to be one-size-fits-all patchwork quilts to wear. They can be fashionably styled, flattering to every body type, and comfortable -- whether your taste is tailored and shaped, soft and drapery, casual, or elegant. It's just a matter of making some thoughtful choices.

- (1) Fabric: Choose soft and supple fabrics and colors that are compatible in terms of value and intensity. It's often best to start with one fabric you love and build around it. Don't be afraid to mix fibers and textures. Use some prints and geometrics, but don't over do them.
- (2) Style: Choose a pattern that's flattering to your body type. Quilting doesn't have to ad bulk or weight. In fact, well-directed colors and stitching designs can help to minimize parts of the figure. Don't shy away from darts, pleats, or princess styling.
- (3) Piecing method: Choose traditional, block piecing; curved, applique piecing; or garment-section piecing. Piece the entire garment or just portions like the side panels, yoke, front, etc.
- (4) Batting and lining: Very important and there are lots of choices available. Choose battings of cotton, polyester, a combination of the two, wool, or silk. Choose battings that are bonded, needle-punched, with or without scrim, and in a variety of thicknesses. Use fabric like flannel, lightweight cotton, even gauze or quilt with no batting at all. Always check care requirements and follow manufacturers instructions. Choose linings that are soft, strong, and preferably slippery for jackets and coats like silk or rayon.
- (5) Quilting lines: Choose straight or curved lines, grids, or random quilting. Quilt each garment section separately.
- (6) Thread: Choose colors and types that enhance the garment. Thread can unify the piecing. There are lots of options like rayon, silk, cotton, polyester, metallic, mylar, and variegated threads.
- (7) Finishing: For seams, use serging, binding, flat-felling, or a Hong Kong finish. On outer edges, use binding, piping, edge-to-edge linings, or traditional facings.
- (8) Embellishments: Beading, embroidery, stamping, stenciling, decorative stitching.
- (9) Closures: Choose interesting buttons and loops, ties; snaps; even hooks or zippers. And don't be afraid to try traditional machine buttonholes.
