alot of activity this last month.



Getting To Know You. . .

Maylinda Perkins, Former Derby Neighborhood Group Co-Chairman (Interviewed by Chapter Secretary Sondra Schmittgens): Malynda is a preacher's kid who has lived in Kansas her whole life. She is married to Peter and has four children, Phillip 10, Duncan 5, Robin 3 and Nycholas 1. Malynda has a marketing degree from Southwestern College. In the new year she will be taking a Web Page Building class. This is why she loves working on the advertising for the guild and now co-chairing the Membership position with the guild. She says she loves it as much as sewing.

Malynda's mother is a sewing teacher but her grandmother really taught her to sew. She took sewing in high school, as many of us do, but has gotten a lot of sewing experience from different workshops and classes. She has gone to the Sewing and Craft Expo and the ASG National Conference. She has taken classes from Jenny Haskins, Nancy Erikson, Cynthia Guthie and Mary Flurry. She also gives our own Anne St. Clair from Needlenook a lot of credit for teaching her how to sew knits and how to use clear elastic for gathering. If you want to start a fight ask Malynda to gather something for you the old way.

Malynda is heavily involved in machine embroidery. She is also a custom clothier (or, she likes the word "tailoress") and enjoys doing alterations. Malynda's biggest sewing challenge is finishing things on time. Anyone else have a problem with that? She feels that people who can work to a deadline have a special gift. When she gets time she really wants to work on stitch building which she learned from a Jenny Haskins class.

Malynda says the Derby group is really fun and exciting. It started because several members of our Guild just could not make it to NW Wichita. Malynda says it is not really accurate to call her the leader of this group as it is a real team effort. She is more of the spokesperson.

Okay! Now for the 5 Questions. Q: Does she prefer Butterick or Vogue? A: I choose Butterick for fit and Vogue for style. Q: Does she prefer linen or Permapress? A: Linen. Q: Sew or eat Chocolate? A: Can do both at the same time. Q: Does she always backstitch? A: I reverse back stitch (She starts 1/4 inch down, backs up and then sews forward.) Q: Her favorite tool? A: I can't pick one, my three favorite are erasable marking pens, my French curve and clear elastic.

Included in both are lots of unusual embellishment techniques that can be used in many of other ways.



The Language of Sewing (Southern Style)

Many are surprised to find out how I have struggled with the language associated with sewing. To fully understand my struggles let me first make you aware that I live in a part of the country where the average man thinks a "SOWEN MACHINE" is what farmers use to plant with. I have deiced to make a short list of just a few of the words used in this craft that I have had to give a second and sometimes a third look.

1. Basting (southern pronunciation "Bastin") When I first came across this word it was printed on some cloth I had bought that had the pattern printed right on the fabric, along with the instructions. As I remember, it said something like this: cut pattern piece and baste the batting in place. I read it several times before I finally got up and went to the kitchen and got the melted butter. I finally ask some dear ladies I know what it meant and was told the REAL definition of basting. And to think of all that butter I have been wasting on the breasts of turkeys, can't wait till next Thanksgiving when we will "baste" the turkey with long loose stitches.

Interfacing (southern pronun-ciation "Enterfacein") I first ran across that one on a pattern I was trying to put together for my wife. I had always thought that interfacing referred to an object on the out side that was turned so it would face the in side ("the bird house in the yard had a front opening that was INTERFACING"). That was up until I heard a computer show a year or so back that was about one computer program INTERFACING with another. Well, as you can see I have been deluded TWICE. As it turns out -- a INTERFACING turns IN!!!

3. Loop Turner (southern pronunciation "Loop Turner" -- we can say SOME things you know) Although I have never actually used this word BS (Before Sewing), When I saw it the first time, I was sure it was a reference to the condition of a man after he had had too many (i.e. John pulled a REAL LOOP TURNER last night). Oh well, I suppose the Sewing loop turner is much more dignified and meaningful. Besides I haven't "pulled a loop turner" in YEARS.

Notions (southern pronunciation "Noshuns") Now this one I was SURE I knew the meaning of I have heard this term all my life, it is a revered term here in the south and frankly I'm surprised us sewers got the right to

confuse the meaning. Around here a notion is something someone takes (i.e. John took a NOTION to go fishing instead of working today). Well I now have been enlightened as to the REAL meaning of the word, and I am currently looking for a non-sewing replacement to fill the void in my vocabulary.

This is just a few of the words I have stumbled over in times past. I have been studying hard and continue to learn the sewers vocabulary. Just the other day for example a friend of mine on the Internet informed me that a "pintuck" was NOT a type of duck that comes from Canada!! I am a quick study and am learning fast, so please look over me if I slip up once in a while and "TAKE" a notion instead of buying a "notion".

PLEASE NOTE: I have been BORN and RAISED in the SOUTH. I thereby am dully licensed to poke fun at the southern peoples and states. However, YOU are another story, It could get ugly if you try this and are not from the south (and flying OVER the south don't count). You are allowed to laugh at us quietly as long as you don't let any of US see you!!!
