## THESE SEWING TIPS ARE TREATS... NOT TRICKS!



Do you need some pattern weights? Fill empty 35mm film canisters with aquarium sand or regular sand to make some very quick and inexpensive ones.

If you leave a scorch mark on wool because of a too hot iron, take a nickel and rub it on the mark. The scorch should disappear.

You can reduce the bulk from pocket flaps by cutting the top flap from the fashion fabric and the bottom flap from lining fabric. This works for side pockets as well. Making sure that you cut the part you'll see from the fashion fabric.

Keep the facing of your garment from showing on the right side of the garment by stitching in the ditch at the shoulder seam. It looks better, is faster and is more secure.



#### LEARNING FROM OUR FEATHERED FRIENDS: LESSONS FROM THE GEESE

A flock of geese is worth watching. As each goose flaps its wings, it creates uplift for the bird following. By flying in "V" formation, the whole flock adds 71% more flying range than if each bird flew alone.

Lesson: People who share a common direction and sense of community can go farther and get where they are going quicker and easier, because they are traveling on the trust of one another.

When the lead goose gets tired, it rotates back in the formation and another goose flies at the point position.

Lesson: It pays to take turns doing the challenging tasks and sharing leadership. People, like geese, are interdependent.

The geese in formation honk from behind to encourage those up front to keep up the speed.

Lesson: We need to make sure that our honking from behind is encouraging, not irritating, or worse yet, critical.

When a goose gets sick, wounded or shot down, two geese drop out of formation and follow it down to help protect it. They stay with the goose until it is able to fly again or dies. Then, they launch out on their own with another formation or catch up to the original flock.

Lesson: We have as much sense as geese do, let us likewise stand by and care for one another.

#### Did You Know. . .

Teflon ironing board covers prevent steam from penetrating through your fabrics, can cause shine on woolens, makes fusibles bubble, and increases the heat given off by an iron set to a lower temperature?

If you have a Teflon cover you might want to consider replacing it with a 100% cotton cover to ensure the best results for your garments. You already have the pattern. Just copy the old cover and you're set. Now you can be sure of perfect settings and if needed just pop into the washer for a clean and fresh cover. #### **PUMPKIN PECAN BUNDT CAKE**



#### **Ingredients:**

1 package spice cake mix

1 c. canned pumpkin

1/2 c. oil

1 package instant vanilla pudding

3 eggs

1 tsp. cinnamon

1/2 c. water

1/2 c. chopped pecans

Combine all ingredients, except pecans. Blend well, then beat for 5 minutes. Fold in pecans. Bake in a greased and floured Bundt pan at 350 degrees for 45 minutes. Cool in pan for 15 minutes and then turn out. Sprinkle with powdered sugar or drizzle with glaze of your choice before serving.

#### **PUMPKIN COFFEECAKE**

#### **Ingredients:**

1/2 c. butter

3/4 c. sugar

1 tsp. vanilla

3 eggs

2 c. flour

1 tsp. baking powder

1 tsp. baking soda

1 c. sour cream

1-3/4 c. pumpkin (16 oz. can)

1 slightly beaten egg

1/3 c. sugar

1 tsp. pumpkin pie spice

#### Streusel:

1 c. packed brown sugar

1/3 c. butter

2 tsp. cinnamon

1 c. chopped nuts

Cream butter, 3/4 c. sugar and vanilla in bowl, add eggs and beat well. Combine flour, baking powder, and baking soda. Add ingredients to butter mixture, alternating with sour cream to make batter.

Combine pumpkin, egg, 1/3 c. sugar, and pie spice. Keep separate.

Prepare Streusel by mixing ingredients together with fork or hands until crumbly. Set aside.

Spoon half batter mixture into 9" x 13" pan, sprinkle half of the streusel over the batter. Spread the pumpkin mixture over the streusel. Carefully spread

the remaining batter over the pumpkin mixture. Sprinkle the remaining streusel over the top. Bake at 325 degrees for 50-60 minutes until toothpick comes out clean.
