



Sausage Hash Brown Bake

2 lbs bulk pork sausage 2 c. (8oz.) skredded ekeddar ekeese, divided

1 can (10-3/4 oz.) cream of chicken soup, undiluted

1 c. (8oz.) sour cream

1 carton (8 oz.) French onion dip

1 c. chopped onion

1/4 c. chopped green pepper

1/4 c. sweet red pepper

1/8 tsp. pepper

I pkg. (30 oz.) frozen skredded kask brown potatoes, tkawed In large skillet, cook sausage over

medium heat until no longer pink, drain on paper towels. In large bowl, combine 1-3/4 cups of cheese and the next seven ingredients: fold

in potatocs.

Spread half-into a greased shallow 3-qt. baking dish. Top with sausage and remaining potato mixture.

Sprinkle with remaining checse.
Cover and bake at 350 degrees for
45 minutes. Vneover; bake 10 minutes longer or until heated through.
Yield: 10-12 servings

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
