Clothing or Fabric Prewash

1/2 Cup ammonia
1/2 Cup white vinegar
2 quarts warm water
1/2 Cup baking soda
4 tablespoons liquid soap
Mix all ingredients and shake
well. Pour a portion into a
spray container. Store the rest
in a gallon jug (please clearly
mark you label). To use, spray
on soiled area and let sit for 23 minutes prior to washing.




