FITTING FOCUS

Do you need underarm room in a garment? A gusset may be your answer! Inserting a gusset under the arm in the seams works well and just may work for you.

Open seams 2-3 inches to create opening. Reinforce seam ends with fusable interfacing. Resew garment seam to insert point. This will stabilize these points. Rough cut large diamond in matching or contrasting fabric to use as insert. Have bias running point to point. Gently shape underarm opening and baste in diamond. Try on, adjust, then sew in and trim. Voila, you can now move your arm with ease!!! What a relief it is!!

Remember all the Tips that Larry Black gave us on how to clean our sewing machines. Try WD-40 to clean the bobbin race but remember to oil well after. And don't use any kind of forced air to clean your machine! This puts fabric lint in places you don't even want to know about.

TREASURER'S REPORT 2003

We set our budget up to break even. We actually made \$18.14 more than we spent this year. Our special events netted \$955.25. Our advertising income was down by about half over 2002. Hopefully with some new businesses in the area this will change for the better. The newsletter cost was reduced by about \$200. Postage wa up \$60 but not due to the newsletter. For example, to advertise our Fabric Carnival we sent letters to people who previously rented booth space. Postage adds up for these things but all in all we came out ahead.

We hope to have some workshops in 2004 given by our own knowledgeable members. This would definitely increase our income.

We had a very busy and exciting year in 2003. There was some kind of special event almost every month. Our board is to be commended for their generous sharing of time and talent. Our guild remains an educational and financially solvent organization in our community due to the hard work of our members and chapter advisory board.



FOR ALL YOU TRASH EATIN' RETREAT GOERS...HERE'S YOUR RECIPE!

TIAJUANA TRASH

13 oz. bag of BITE SIZE TOSTITOS

1 BAG BUTTERED FLAVOR POPCORN (MICRO) POPPED

6 CUPS CRISPIX

2 CANS MIXED NUTS

MIX ABOVE INGREDIENTS IN ROASTER

PUT IN SAUCE PAN AND BRING TO A BOIL:

2 STICKS MARGARINE

1 CUP BROWN SUGAR

1 CUP CORN SYRUP

2 TSP CINNAMON

1 TSP CAYENNE PEPPER -(I only used 1/4 of a TSP)
POUR OVER STUFF IN THE ROASTER AND MIX WELL.

BAKE 250 FOR 1 HOUR. STIR EVERY 20 MINUTES. COOL ON WAX PAPER.
