'You can't make clothes fit? Make clothes that don't have to fit!' That was one of Linda's opening remarks. I have been concentrating so hard on learning how to fit things and here comes this person telling me it is just not so darn important. That was just the beginning of the 'Liberation License' that Linda gave us. We can do whatever we want and she will help us do it!

Linda took 89 of us through her line of loose, flowy patterns, each of which has only a few pieces. We learned a great deal about Slinky. She challenged us all to try on the same pair of slinky pants to see how many of us looked good in that pattern with that fabric...everyone who tried them on *did* look great.

Linda had clothes made out of towels, blankets, placemats and all manner of non-clothes items! The embellishment ideas (leather, silk, braids, yarns, you name it) were very inspiring and practical. Linda said of her 'Crazy Quilt' jacket, 'Don't worry about getting food on it...just applique over it.' She never has the same pockets on both sides of a garment. 'This whole match, measure, fuss 'thing', I don't like!

I predict there will be a looser freer Wichita Guild in the near future. As Linda MacPhee says, 'There are no ules to this game, I think you guessed that!'

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
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

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#### Wearing Ease and Design Ease

Wearing ease is the built -in liveablility found in most patterns. Without it your clothing would not allow you to sit, move or breathe comfortably. The approximate wearing ease is 2 1/2 to 3 1/2" for bust; 1" for waist and 2 1/2 to 2 3/4 for hips. Some patterns may have very little or no wearing ease at all. Halters, very cut-away armholes and strapless bodices have to fit very closely to the body. If the pattern says 'use stretchable knits only' it will have less wearing ease because the fabric's elasticty allows for movement and comfort.

Design ease (fashion ease) is the extra fullness added to a garment by the designer to make many different silhouettes. A 'closely fitted' garment would have no design ease, just wearing ease. A 'fitted' garment has just a very little extra ease. 'Semi-fitted' clothing may have up to 4' of design ease in the bust area, 'loosely fitted' may have as much as 8 extra inches and a 'very loosely fitted' dress may have more than 8". Coats and Jackets have more ease than other clothes to accommodate your clothing underneath.
