



#### Pattern Seminar for the Home Clothier

The goal of this Pattern Seminar is to simplify the learning process of pattern making in a very logical manner. The pattern seminar begins with learning drafting techniques with a clear understanding of pattern design, principles of proportion, balance and fit. Using hands-on techniques with ½ scale patterns the class will then work with basic pattern techniques, princess lines for styling bodices, dresses and tunics. These pattern skills can be applied to an existing blouse, shirt, dress or pants pattern of your choice and/or start from scratch. By applying these skills one will be able to create her own look and design a wardrobe to her liking.

**Plus**, learn how a design becomes a pattern, how to drape a live model, how master patterns are made, styling techniques, how to make a sleeve from scratch, change sleeves so they move and fit correctly, how to make a dress form within an hour and how to choose the right interfacing for your projects.

### The American Sewing Guild Presents STRATEGIC PLAN HIGHLIGHTS: 2004-2006

"Advancing sewing as an art and life skill"

Note: The following summary highlights ASG's strategies for longevity and advancement as compiled following the 2003 joint meeting of ASG's regional representatives and national board of directors. Chapter presidents received the full version of the plan in April 2004.

#### HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE PLAN

The American Sewing Guild's overall strategy is to foster moderate organizational change, membership growth, and financial security. Growth will become ASG's focus: increasing membership, increasing revenues, and strengthening the organizational culture with an eye to creating the ASG of the future. We must remain a strong community that offers attractive products and services to an active public that is challenged by time and competing life priorities. Our successes depend on our strategy to gradually shift the emphasis from fortifying internal structure to seeking external opportunities. ASG will become more influential among allies in the sewing community as we demonstrate growth. In return, our members will enjoy an enriched sewing community, a wealth of ASG-associated products and services, participate in the preservation and promotion of sewing as an art and life skill.

#### MEMBERSHIP AND CHAPTER LEADERSHIP

ASG values strong chapter leadership as the key to encouraging organizational growth. Improvements in ASG's governance standards, volunteer training, and membership recruitment and retention activities are the target objectives. Projects in these areas include:

- Revised Organizational by-laws and articles of incorporation
- · Revised chapter policy and procedures
- New additions to the ASG Leadership Library
- Enhanced leadership training and resources for chapter presidents and advisory boards
- New tools for organizational and leadership selfassessment and feedback
- Data collection on membership growth & retention
- New programs and training to encourage youth membership, diversity, and new chapter development
- Continued efforts to promote excellence through ASG's Awards Program

Public awareness of ASG will increase through additional advertising, publicity, and creative, cost-effective marketing. As resources become available, we will broaden national promotional efforts by implementing a comprehensive marketing plan including the use of print and mass media. We will extend all national efforts to the local level by providing marketing resources and training for chapters.

#### PARTNERSHIPS, COLLABORATIVE PROJECTS, AND COMMUNITY SERVICE

Partnerships and collaborative projects with manufacturers, retailers, trade associations, and other needle/fiber arts organizations are key to increasing the public awareness of ASG and sewing. Community service projects allow our members to contribute to their communities and increase public awareness of the value of sewing. ASG will seek additional funding resources for chapters in the form of grants and donations and will provide education and support for grant writing and project management at the chapter level.

#### FINANCE AND SUPPORT SERVICES

ASG has acquired a sound financial foundation and seeks to use resources creatively and wisely in the pursuit of growth. We will seek alternative sources of revenue as well as increased membership revenue. We will adhere to regular organizational assessment of all ASG programs and staff in order to maintain high efficiency and cost-effectiveness in our organization. We will encourage chapters to adopt the same high standards for financial management through increased training and assessment tools.



Mr. Blue would like to have several garments, adult and child, and would like to have them in the near future.



#### Cherry Dump Cake from Bag Lady Social **Ruby Chrisco**

2 cups Cherry Pie Filling

1 large can Crushed Pineapple (drained and save the juice for later)

1 Yellow Cake Mix

2 sticks Margarine, melted (I used only one)

Mix the margarine and pineapple juice into the cake mix and layer in an ungreased 9x13 cake pan as follows:


