Treasurer's Report 2004

Each year we set our budget up to break even. In 2004 we actually cleared more than we spent. This is a good thing. It gives us a little more working capital in case one of our special events or other planned expenses costs us more than we anticipated. Actually two of our 2004 special events - Linda MacPhee's workshop and the Oklahoma City bus trip are the reasons we came out ahead. They increased our treasury after expenses. Our other special events - Coni Crawford, retreat and No Bus Bus Trip - either broke even or cost us more than we took in for them. With more input from our general membership as to the type of events they will support we can keep our treasury solvent rather than deplete it. Our newsletter is very close to supporting itself. A few more advertisers and it will be self supporting. Since we receive a portion of ASG membership dues back from National ASG we can also gain revenue by increasing the number of members we have. With the joint efforts of our Cabinet Advisory Board and our general membership Wichita ASG can continue to be an informative, educational and financially successful group.

The quilts should be 45"x60", materials must be new 100% cotton (this means fabric, batting, thread and ties), fabrics must be pre-washed. If tying, the tails must be no longer than 3/4". **Must include 1/2 yd. St Jude Fabric.**

2005 Election Highlight

This fall many of our Board positions are up for reelection. We will be showcasing one board position each newsletter to let you know what that person does and to tempt you to fill their shoes in 2006. Open positions for 2006 are President, VP, Treasurer, Librarian/Historian, Membership, Newsletter, Education, Community Service, Publicity/Retail Liaison, Special Events and Hospitality.

SPECIAL EVENTS

This position is responsible for the planning, coordination and execution of the special events to include special speakers, bus trips, retreats and the fabric carnival. A committee may be appointed for each special event.

Each event is different in its planning requirements. Bus trips are a matter of contacting the destination shops, setting up a schedule of the days events with the arrival and departure times at each location and arranging for the transportation.

Speakers consist of gathering information about topics and prices from numerous potential speakers, presenting the information to the board of directors, then setting up the event with the chosen speaker. To set up the event a space needs to be reserved, accommodations made for the speaker, food arrangements made for the event as well as set up and take down.

Retreats include reserving the facility, arranging for food and activities at the retreat.

The Fabric Carnival requires reserving space for the event, planning space requirements for set up and take down, food, community service project, membership and the sewing guild sales tables.

All of the special events require the planning and preparation of advertising, preparation and collecting of the registration forms and the collection of the money. Preparation of the ASG income form, ASG Program Production Budget Form and the Expense Reimbursement Form are done at the end of each event.
