GIFT GIVING IDEAS

This list is to help make you gift giving stress free.
You don't need a big budget to take advantage of
these gift ideas. You don't have to be an expert sewer.
All you need are some supplies and a little imagination.

- BEGINNER'S KIT- Put together a special basket with assorted notions and a book on beginning sewing for that beginner sewer.
- MEMEORY ALBUMS Cover a basic photo or scrapbook with fabric to showcase cherished photos.
- DO—IT—YOURSELF KIT—Put together a basket of items needed to complete a whole project.
- 4. WRAP—your gifts in fabric.
- EMERGENCY MENDING KITS—Assemble items that both men or women would need for emergency. Include thread, needle, buttons, etc.
- DECOR PILLOWS— These can be customize for each persons home or style.
- STUFFED DOLLS OR ANIMALS—These are perfect for both young and old.
- MACHINE EMBROIDERY GIFT BASKET— Put together a basket of items used in machine embroidery like specialty threads, stabilizers, needles, and etc.
- TOTE BAG— Sew an oversized bag that can be used for carrying supplies to classes. Also the bag can also be the gift wrap for an odd shaped gift. Two gifts in one.
- NOTE CARDS—Pick up blank stationery and customize them with fabric scraps, trimmings, buttons, and etc. Tie six cards together and add a fancy pen.




HINTS AND TIPS

Ever wonder whether you should use a vertical or a horizontal buttonhole? Here are some things to consider. Vertical buttonholes work well on lightweight fabrics and non-stress areas. Horizontal buttonholes are used to stabilize areas of stress. such as cuffs, neck bands, or waistbands. Buttonholes on coats or jackets are usually horizontal.


