
Duties of the Vice-President by Becky Wondra



For this newsletter I am going to focus on websites for outdoor/sports clothing. Recently I went to several sports stores in town (Gart Sports, Dick's Sports and Mountain HIgh) to see what was different about their clothing than what one could buy at Dillards. Well, let me tell you they were very different. Of course they were more casual but all the clothing is made to be comfortable for people who move! What an idea!

Now I know you are saying, 'Well, Sondra, my kayaking days are way over!'. That may be true but even though you aren't mountain biking you are still moving around! Maybe just up the stairs with laundry, or to the car with

groceries or doing some jobs in the old garden but it is still, by definition, movement!

What I found was that these clothes are cut and sewn differently to allow you to move and to make you feel comfortable while doing it. Gussetted crotches and underarms, darts or fullness in the KNEES of pants so that you can do an extreme bend. Shorts side seams are cut slightly on the bias and move forward as they move away from your waist. Even clothes made out of lycra fabric had fitting seams to let the clothes mold to you for greater comfort and movement. And the fabrics they used are made to wick moisture away from you, to keep water off of you, to keep warmth next to your body or for summer clothing to keep air moving around your body. And all of it seemed to be able to dry quickly!

And the design details were truly wonderful! I will describe the two favorite things I saw. First, a semi fitted princess blouse, sleeveless with a shirt-like collar. But in the princess seams were two teardrop pockets that closed with invisible zippers. The inside of the pockets were tacked with twill tape to the front bands so that they would not hang below the shirt. It was so lovely that you could wear it to work but I could see how wonderful it would be on a

hike also.

My other favorite (which I bought) was a pair of pants with a regular inseam and side seam but it also had another seam going down the front at about the spacing you would use for a front pocket...and guess what? In that front seam there were pockets! As you follow the seam to the knee there was a small dart exactly over the knee (which lets your knee bend without straining your fabric). As you go down to the hem there is about a one inch slit to get the pant on over your shoes if you are of that persuasion.

If you look at this clothing and there is nothing that you would want ot buy you can still include these wonderful

fitting ideas and pocket treatments into the clothing that you make. Okay! Here are the sites!

www.llbean.com - Okay! This is the absolute best site to go to because it has 'My Virtual Model'. You can actually program in a model that looks like your body type and dimensions, even your hair style! Mine really freaked me out. You can see how their clothes will really look on you!

www.patagonia.com - This site has really great zoom capability and you can also choose to see the clothing on a model. Look at 'W's reversable garden skirt'.

www.columbia.com - Click on the color key to get a drawing of the details.

www.athleta.com - Go to the 'Camino Pant' to see how they put room in the knee.

www.fabriclink.com - This site is an educational resource for fabrics, apparel, home furnishing and care. This site has a lot of info about what the new fabrics and fabric treatments are. You can even type in the fabric you are interested in and learn all about it.

www.denverfabrics.com - wonderful on many levels and they carry outdoor fabrics too.
