
Everyone had such a wonderful time enjoying the delicious food, fun, and fellowship.





Community Service "Sew-In"

On Tuesday, June 6, 2006, 34 members and guests of the Wichita Chapter of the American Sewing Guild met at the Sedgwick County Extension Office to work on the Community Service project for the year. Two hundred and ninety-two hours were volunteered for the project. The Communities in Schools will be receiving 34 fleece hats, 17 fleece caps, 44 fleece scarves and 81 pairs of mittens. The national project for this year is baby layette items. 11 rompers, 1 dress, 4 gowns, 5 long sleeved t-shirts, 6 short sleeved t-shirts and 8 receiving blankets were completed. Many more baby items are cut out and ready to be sewn. Mittens and hats were taken to be completed at home by some of our members. A portion of the baby items will go to the national meeting with Betty Brees. The remainder will be donated to local charities to be used here in Wichita.

There are several kits still available for members to sew. If you would like to help sew these baby items contact Barbara Blackman. Kits will also be available at the August meeting for those interested.
