Becky Wondra has served on the Board since the Wichita Chapter beginning.

Becky was born in Great Bend, Kansas, and raised on a farm near Rozel, Kansas in West Central Kansas. She is married to Steve, her high school sweetheart. Their children are Keith, Curtis and his wife Kirsten.

She started sewing in 4-H at age of seven using a treadle machine. She embroidered and hemmed Tea Towels. Her first real projects were the wrist pin cushion and the gingham apron.

Her biggest sewing challenge was making a white formal for 4-H. During construction she sewed through her finger, the needle broke off inside, and she bled on the gown. With real mid-west stoicism, her worry was getting the blood out the fabric rather than the needle out of her finger! A true sewing fanatic. Becky also made a complete ensemble for the style review which included a coat, dress, and a hat dyed to match. She was featured in the Hutchinson Herald during the September State Fair in 1964.

Becky sewed for profit when her boys were growing up. The articles ranged from wedding & bridesmaids dresses, alternations for all the family, cushions, and costumes for Northwest High School Plays.

She said her real motivation for continuing to sew was because she was so tall and thin. For the perfect fit, she had to sew.

ASG WICHITA CHAPTER **MAY MEETING** "Cutting Up Your Pattern" Marilyn Beaver



Marilyn began by saying that much of her education on altering patterns came from classes she has taken with designers such as Mary Ray, Diane Ericson, and Linda McPhee. She encouraged everyone to take advantage of workshops when every the opportunity arises because it is the best way to learn new techniques.

Marilyn's program gave several tips on altering patterns to get a new look and add "punch" to your garment. She states that, "the reason for cutting a pattern is that it gives more opportunities to fit the garment, it creates added details, it adds style lines, and it creates more surface design."

Other tips she gave were as follows:

- Remember when cutting your pattern Trace the original so you have it as a reference and can use it again.
- Copy the drawings so you can play with designs.
- Pay attention to grain lines and transfer these to all new pattern pieces.
- Add notches to newly created pattern pieces to establish a point of reference when stitching them together.
- Add seam allowances to all newly created pattern pieces.

Louise Cutting Is Coming To Wichita

Who is Louise Cutting and Why is she coming to Wichita?

Louise Cutting is the president and CEO of Fabric Collections in Winter Park, Florida. Although the shop is closed (due to three hurricanes in 2004) Louise is still designing clothing that is flattering to today's women and their lifestyles. The "The Cutting Line Design" patterns have serene style, offer simple shapes and modern lines for a peaceful balance with a timeless and easy elegance. The One Seam pant is one of Louise's best known patterns. Her pattern directions are written with extreme detail and are easy to understand. She gives you lots of options to try different techniques in each of her patterns and she also has a series of booklets titled "Expert Tips and Techniques for Fine Sewing".

Louise is a Fashion Illustrator, was the Department Head of the Fashion Merchandising and Design program at The Art Institute of Fort Lauderdale and Prospect Hall College. She taught Interior Design at Mary Mount College. She founded 'Cutting Corner, Inc.', a successful couture custom clothing business and designed bridal gowns, tailored suits, maternity and 'high end' sportswear. The designs and illustrates the step-by-step instructions and text for her patterns. When you open one of Louise's patterns, there is a noticeable difference when compared with the instructions we are used to seeing.

In one day at a Louise Cutting seminar, I personally learned more basic, easy to use techniques than I had learned in all the years I have been sewing. These are techniques that each and every one of us can master with ease and use in our everyday sewing to make each project look professional. Louise is coming to the Wichita Chapter of the American Sewing Guild to share her knowledge and give each and every one of us the techniques to successful sewing.

How can I check the National Web Site for 'Special Offers'?





The annual Community Service Sew-In will be held Tuesday, June 6, 2006, from 11:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. Bring a sack lunch for the noon meal then for dinner we will order Pizza to be ready at 6:00 p.m. Snacks and drinks will be available in the afternoon.

Bring your sewing machines, sewing supplies, sergers, cutting supplies, and happy faces.

There will be items precut and ready to sew at 11:00 a.m. More cutting will need to be done, as well as, ironing on interfacing and installing snaps.

The projects this year are fleece mittens, hats and scarves for the Communities in Schools and the National ASG project is baby and toddler layette items. Many children in our community go to school in the winter with cold hands and ears. When it is time to go on field trips, the schools like to have the fleece items available to dress the children for the cold. The items are also given to the children to take home. As we all know, these are items that are easily mislaid, so we are trying to produce a large inventory for the schools to work from.

The ASG National project is the layette items made from a McCall pattern. The McCall pattern company has provided pattern #8574 for our use in making baby items. Sewing baby clothing is fun and rewarding. A few of the items we make will be sent to the National Convention to be distributed in the Washington DC area. A majority of the items will be used here locally. The distribution will be determined after we see how many items we have. The Communities in Schools have need for baby items as well as Interfaith Ministries, Harbor House, Youthville, Pregnancy Crisis Center and The Salvation Army.

We want to thank all of those members who brought fleece, flannel and cotton knits to make the items with. We have a nice selection to work from. A big thanks to the volunteers who are doing the precutting to give us a head start for the sew-in. We hope to see all at the sew-in.
