Anne was a popular class teacher at the ASG National Convention and is a author of a book on bra construction. Anne has over 20 years experience in making bras, including sports bras, strapless bras, and specialty bras. Her lectures cover not only bra, panties, and slip construction, but lingerie fabrics and embellishments. So don't miss the opportunity to hear Anne's tips and techniques to sewing lingerie.

Do You Know?

The Garibaldi jacket and Garibaldi shirt were bright red woolen garments for women with black embroidery or braid and military details popular in the 1860s; they named after the Italian revolutionary Giuseppe Garibaldi who visited England in 1863.

The **Eisenhower jacket** is a waist-length, military jacket based on the World War II Army "Wool Field Jacket, M-1944" introduced by **General Dwight Eisenhower**.

The **Nehru jacket** is a uniform jacket without lapels or collars, popularized by **Jawaharial Nehru**, the first Prime Minister of Independent *India*.

As a experienced sewer and teacher of Linda McPhee and Linda Lee pattern lines, she was able to give some great ideas and tips on sewing these patterns.



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Soap

Soap slivers work well for marking fabric. Only use plain soap that does not have added oils and moisturizers. The small bars of soap found in hotels work great. After you have used the soap until it is thin with sharp edges, let it dry out and use it for fabric marking. You can sharpen the edges with a razor blade or a nail file.

How can I check the National Web Site for 'Special Offers'?



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

Louise is a nationally recognized sewing expert and the creator of "The Cutting Line Design" patterns known for their detailed and easy to understand instructions. A day of sewing with Louise will give you easy to use tips and techniques that will make your sewing look professional. She will present the latest tips from the designer showrooms in easy to understand ways. She is also known for her "One-Seam Pant" pattern.

On Tuesday, Feb. 6, 2007, there will be a seminar from 12:30 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. This will be a lecture/demo class titled "Cutting Remarks & Cutting In/Cutting Out". Some items to be covered will be designer techniques, many of which can be done completely on the sewing machine, as well as, the proper use of interfacing for your project. Louise will show you the latest trends in details like trim, darts, pleats, seams, waists, zipper fly and "New" side pockets for the "One-Seam Pants". From 7:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. Louise will present "I Love You To Death...Now Change!" This evening event will include an extraordinary trunk show showing Louise's original pattern designs and their variations. This evening session is open to the public free of charge.
