### **Book Review**

The Art of Manipulating Fabric
Bu Colette Wolff

The possibilities for three-dimensional manipulation of fabric-gathering, pleating, tucking, shirring, and quilting woven materials are endless. To describe them all would be to describe the entire history of sewing. However, Colette in her book The Art of Manipulating Fabrics tries to do just that. Colette categorizes all major dimensional techniques, shows how they are related, and gives examples of variations both traditional and modern. The result is an encyclopedia of techniques that resurface, reshape, restructure and reconstruct fabric.

Textile artists and quilters, as well as garment and home décor sewers, will expand their design horizons with the almost limitless effects that can be achieved by using the information found in this incredible book.

# March General Meeting ASG Wichita Chapter

Dawna O'Connor from A-1 Singer Sewing Center was the special speaker for the March general meeting. Her presentation highlighted *All Aspects of Machine Embroi*dery.

The lecture began with what to look for in an embroidery machine, their price, features, warranty and service. Dawna also included information on the operation of the machine including threading, hooping and stitching a design.

The next topic covered was the supplies, such as the different threads, needles, backings and stabilizers. As a special bonus she provided a set of stabilizer swatches and a chart entitled *Putting It All Together: A Needle | Thread | Backing Usage Chart*.

The final topic presented was on troubleshooting embroidery problems with threads, needles, bobbins, fabrics, and embroidery designs.

"Louise Cutting" Seminar

Louise Cutting flew into Wichita from sunny Florida on a cold wind February day. She brought with her oodles of enthusisms and life changing sewing tips and techniques. Louise kept forty-eight women an the edges of their seats not wanting to miss a word on Tuesday afternoon and the number swelled to 65 Tuesday evening. We learned how to add fringe to Jackets, the many wonders of Steam a Seam, how to sew One Seam Pants in an hour, and how to add pockets and pleats to the pants. We heard tips on traveling, packing and how to design a travel wardrobe with special paper dolls and help from the paint store color charts. There will be no more lumpy necklines or armholes when our facings are clipped diagonally as Louise taught us.

On Wednesday, forty-two fortunate ladies spent another day with Louise. This was a hands on sewing day with exercise class. We walked miles back and forth from our sewing machines to the pressing stations. Louise demonstrated each technique, then sent us off to do it ourselves. We learned how to properly use a point turner after pressing seams open over the wooden clapper. What a difference doing it the right way makes. Points went from okay to exceptional and there will be no more poked out points. Louise showed us how to make collars and pocket flaps without seams at the edges. She showed us how to make welt pockets without shedding a tear. If personally always felt like crying when I saw how my welt pockets without shedding a tear. 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#### Video Series Review

This summer a friend loaned me the collection of videos for a BBCproduced series called The House of Elliot. I was caught up in it right away. The story itself is entertaining and could easily carry your interest. Two sisters, Bea and Evie, are suddenly on their own with the death of their well-to-do father. Just as suddenly their newfound freedom from the parental restraints of late Victorian England is dashed when the financial mishandling and romantic dalliances of their father requires them to scale back their lifestyle and their dreams of dressmaking business. As the story progresses, the sisters meet with ongoing successes and occasional setbacks in both business and personal life. Through it all their once simple dressmaking business becomes the House of Elliot, a triumph in the couture world of the 1920's.

For those of us who sew and enjoy fashion, the plot is an added bonus. The clothes are beautiful, beautiful, beautiful. Lessons in costuming, changes in fashion, and the social and technical facets of the fashion world of the early 20th century are incorporated in every scene. We see the couture houses of London from both the luxury of customer dressing rooms to the Spartan backrooms where girls and women work complicated beading and tedious hand stitching for long hours at low wages. The love of luxurious fabrics, fine needlework, and beautiful design is the common ground for both groups of women.

If you can find this series on television or at your local library, do check it out. Whether you savor the plot and the fashion together or fast forward from one beautiful gown to another, you will be fascinated with The House of Elliot. Dorothy Lewis
