#### WANTED!

Elections for the Wichita Chapter Advisory Board will be held on November 6, 2007, at the General Meeting. We are seeking volunteers to serve on the CAB for a one year term. ### Serger Facts and Tips

- Don't ever, ever, sew over pins!
- · Always turn the hand wheel toward you.
- A serger can stitch over 1,500 stitches per minute.
- Overedge = overcast or edge finish/overlock = overcast + seam.
- The shorter the stitch length greater the overcast coverage.
- You can serge in zippers.
- A serger has 2 sets of feet teeth.
- Differential feed (DF) should be set higher for stretchy fabrics.
- A higher DF means the front feed teeth pull fabric in faster than the rear.
- Tension dials: the lower the number the less the pressure; 0 is no tension.
- Thread for the loopers can be anything that will go through the eyes.
- The stitch finger must be moved out of the way for a rolled edge.
- Change needles after every project.

#### **SEPTEMBER**

National Sewing Month

Proclamation 5368 - - National Sewing Month, 1985 September 27, 1985

A Proclamation by the President of the United States of America.

The sewing industry annually honors approximately fifty million people who sew at home and approximately forty million people who sew at least part of their wardrobes. Their initiative, creativity and self-reliance are characteristic of the people of our Nation.

The home sewing industry generates an estimated \$3,500,000,000 annually for the economy of the United States. Home sewing has enhanced career opportunities for many Americans in fields such as fashion, retail merchandising, design, pattern making, and textiles. Learning the art of sewing in the home or in elementary school home economics classes started many on careers in these fields. In recognition of the importance of home sewing to our Nation, the Congress, by Senate Joint Resolution 173, has designated the month of September 1985 as "National Sewing Month", authorizing and requesting the President to issue a proclamation in observance of this month. Now, Therefore, I, Ronald Reagan, President of the United States of America, do hereby proclaim September 1985 as National Sewing Month. I call upon the people of the United States to observe this month with appropriate ceremonies and activities.

In Witness Wherefore, I have hereunto set my hand this twenty-seventh day of September, in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and eighty-five, and of the Independence of the United States of America the two hundred and tenth.

#### Dating Fabrics 2

A Color Guild 1950-2000 Eileen Jahnke Trestain

This informative and easy to use handbook should prove valuable whether you are a curious quilter, fashion sewer, a fabric collector, quilt collector, or an accomplished historian.

Dating Fabric 2 has over 1,000 fabric swatches—From poodle skirts of the 1950s to baby doll dresses of the 1990s, the fabric of everyday life are featured in this handy reference book.

There is a reproduction fabric guide which is an informative section on the fabrics from 1980 - 2000. This section helps you to narrow down a fabrics date and origin. Print swatches are shown actual size, with fabric lines and styles grouped by date and color. Dating divisions are highlighted by an informative history of each era.

The book's inner spiral binding makes the pages lie flat and makes it easier to compare photos to fabrics.

This book is the second book on dating fabrics written by Eileen Trestain, the first book covered the dates 1800—1960. Both books would be great additions to any library.

#### DID YOU KNOW?

The first functional sewing machine was invented by the French tailor, Barthelemy Thimonnier, in 1830. Thimonnier's machine used only one thread and a hooked needle that made the same chain stitch used with embroidery. The inventor was almost killed by an enraged group of French tailors when they burned down his garment factory because they feared unemployment would result from this new invention.

#### DID YOU KNOW?

In the 1850's patterns began appearing in several ladies publications such as Frank Leslie's Gazette of Fashions and Godey's Lady's Book. These early patterns were one size only, so each seamstress had to scale up and alter it to meet her individual needs. In 1863 a New England tailor, Ebenezer Butterick, made paper patterns of a gingham dress designed by his wife Ellen. He graded the patterns so that different sizes could be made. He is responsible for the creation of the pattern industry as we know it today. Butterick then began making shirt patterns and by the 1880's he had several thousand agencies in the U.S. and Canada selling his patterns. He initially established himself in New York, but in 1873 settled in London, on fashionable Regent Street, where his patterns for men, women and children appeared in numerous publications.



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
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
