BOOK REVIEW

"Vintage Fabrics"

Judith Scoggin Gridley, Joan Reed Kiplinger Jessie Gridley McCure

Vintage Fabrics is intended as a reference book that will benefit textile collectors in all fields with the purchasing and identifying vintage cloth-novices, seamstresses, costumers and reenactors, researchers, dealers, students, teachers, quilters, and those who simply like fabrics.

The book is geared to vintage fabrics as a loom product, as yardage, and as a desirable product in the marketplace. The period from 1880-1959 is included with the 1950's chosen for the birth of the synthetics as well as the traditional and natural fiber fabrics.

Fabric information in charts, glossaries, and photos is extended to include a wide range of cotton, silks, and wools plus early rayons and nylons.


Speaker Marsha Doyenne, owner of Country Cousins
