## **Nancy Nix-Rice**

Nancy Nix-Rice treated us to a day packed with learning and fun. Nancy is a very knowledgeable, wonderfully down to earth person. She was so enjoyable and natural that it made the whole day a pleasure.

Her overarching principle was to start to

see the figure one has right now in the positive rather than the negative. Women are used to looking at themselves very critically and form their fashion choices to hide flaws rather than to play up their best features. One of our assignments was to go home and really look at ourselves and describe our figure only in the positive. For

example, 'I have pleasing curvy facial features' rather than 'I have a bumpy, lumpy nose in an overly round face', 'critical fit point' rather than 'fattest part of my body', 'I am lower body dominant' rather than 'I have a huge ass'. You get the idea.

Nancy began our instruction with the

characteristics of color and where to put it on our bodies. (Tip: pick your base neutral based on your hair). She spoke about body shape, how to see which shape we were (Tip: ask someone to look

at you from the back, rather than the front) and then what kind of styles would look best on each type. The goal is to know your own characteristics and to get as many 'points of contact' between you and your clothing as possible. Try to include the aspects of your

color, face/body shape and personal style into your clothing. That is when you will look your best.

We were shown how a minimal shoulder pad made almost all of us look a little taller and thinner. She gave us general 'dress

> thinner' techniques, and told us of the wonders of good 'girl' support. (Tip: Run a string from your throat base to your navel, then fold that length in half back up to your neck base. That is the point your bra should bring your breasts to.) Nancy used people in our audience to illustrate her points. This was very helpful because we were able to see that her

techniques really are successful with us everyday, real people, "There are only 8 supermodels in the world and if we ganged up on them we could reduce that number to 4". (You can just imagine why we enjoyed her!)

As I go over my seven pages of notes there is so much I would like to share with

you. I feel energized and ready to make some changes. Nancy's book and video are in our ASG library and I really recommend them to anyone wanting to make a positive change in appearance. An

improvement in appearance leads to an improvement in self image. Just ask this formerly round faced, no waist, no hip girl now transformed into a pleasantly curvy, upper body dominant woman.






