
The first destination was Oklahoma Quilt Works on the north side of the city. Located in an ordinary looking strip mall, once entered, the store opens up into a colorful array of fabrics, sorted by color families and themes. There were also patterns available for both small (scrap sack, aprons) and large (full sized quilt) projects. It didn't take long for the fabric to start spinning off the bolts! We were also treated to refreshments including homemade cereal cookies. Everyone went home with a goodie bag with some edible treats and a fat quarter of fabric.

A satisfying lunch at Johnnie's Charcoal Broiler got us fueled up for the second, and most anticipated,



Back on the bus for the long drive to Wichita, and the wind did not let up for a second. I thought I was going to need the Dramamine at one point, as the bus was bouncing around and dodging even less maneuverable vehicles. We got back tired but happy at around 6:30 pm. Johnnie's had a slightly different routine where you got in line to order, then found your table and some implements and condiments, and then waited for them to call your name, but didn't pay until the food was ready. It was a quick turn-around and back on the bus for the south side of the big city.





## Community Service Project

We have started a new project this year making quilts for the children in hospital. 125 quilts have been made, 119 have been delivered to Wesley Hospital and 6 to Ronald McDonald House. The quilts are to comfort children in the hospital and for them to take home after, not necessarily to keep them warm. Theresa is still hosting quilting sessions in her home.

We have also been making tote bags for children in the children's home for the children to keep their personal items in. 109 bags have been delivered to the Wichita Children's Home.

We will also start making items for the Community Baby Shower to be held this fall. We will start with crib sheets at the new location of Sew Much in Parklane Shopping center on June 21 at 10 am. Additional sessions will be posted on Facebook and our blog and emailed as they are organized.

## Book Review

Kaffe Fassett's Quilts in the Sun – 20 Designs for Patchwork and Quilting, A Rowan Book, Taunton Press, 2007, 144pp.

Quilt designs by Fassett and ten other designers using Fassett's fabrics are inspired by the landscape and architecture of Portugal. The first third of the book consists of stunning color photos of each quilt against the architectural backdrop that inspired it, along with a close-up detail of the quilt. The inspiration may be a color, a shape a piece of art, or a richly tiled building.

The remainder of the book includes detailed instructions to make each quilt, accompanied by a flat shot photo of the finished quilt and colored piecing diagrams. Full size templates are found at the back of the book, along with four pages of start-to-finish instructions for the novice quilter and a glossary of quilting terms.

The quilts are quite doable, but even if you don't, it's a wonderful book to browse through.


## Requested Recipe

### "Macaroons" by Pat Postlethwait

2 egg whites 1 cup sugar Pinch of salt 1 tsp. vanilla 2 cups post toasties (or cornflakes) 1 cup coconut (Angel Flake)

Beat egg whites with an electric mixer until stiff. While still beating, gradually add sugar. Add a pinch of salt and vanilla. Fold in the cornflakes and coconut.

Drop by teaspoons on parchment paper lined cookie sheet. Bake at 350°F for 15 minutes. Let cool before removing from the paper.


