The second class was Furoshiki: Fabric Folding with the Pixeladies. This was fun and I will be demonstrating some at the eastside neighborhood group in October.

Connie Crawford gave the Fall/Winter Fashion Forecast during lunch. According to her report black and gray are dominant with accent of beige, camel and indigo blue. Contrasts are out, with the exception of a classic white shirt or blouse. Some color is back with caution and usually used with black. My afternoon class was Sewing with Silk with Katrina Walker and I came home with a notebook containing samples of different types of silk and different seam finishes. That evening Les and I took the City of L.A. Night tour and I discovered there really was life outside the hotel!

Sunday morning we played with yo-yos in a class by Diane Ricks and then Sandra Miller talked about making changes to shirt patterns by Louise Cutting. Lunch was capped off with the induction of Judy Barlow into the Sewing Guild Hall of Fame. She wrote "My Mitered Welt Pocket" which can

be found in Threads as the envelope pocket. The last class was Vest-S-Cape by Marsha McClintock. It is a completely serged cape that I finished in class and wore to dinner that night.

Monday morning we were up and raring to go on the FIDM (Fashion Institute of Design & Merchandising) tour and fabric shopping. FIDM was very interesting and the shopping was heaven! I looked at fabric for \$70/yd but nothing insisted on going home with me but when we found the fabric by the pound it was jumping into my arms!

LA and Headquarters put on a great conference. At least 4,241 turtles had been turned in. In 2012 the conference will be in Houston and in 2013 at the Hyatt/Crystal City in Arlington VA. 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Special Report: Maliki Mums in Kenya

Jambo! (hello) The American Sewing Guild team expanded its outreach this summer in the Kenyan community of Maai Mahiu by hosting a 3 day sewing seminar for 30 women, 20 of whom had never sewn before. This extremely popular seminar was deemed a huge success by both instructors and participants. Projects included table runners, reusable sanitary pads, tea towels, pillowcases, bags, and how to use a commercial sewing pattern. Our newest initiative was reusable sanitary pads. A recent Kenyan news report stated that 800,000 girls miss a week of school each month during their period. By being able to make a washable pad, women and girls can go on with a normal routine.

Another project was the CTC LIFE Jacket, a reusable coffee cup sleeve. Since receiving this additional training, the women's production efficiency for LIFE Jackets has nearly tripled. Thanks to a partnership with Whole Foods, LIFE Jackets will soon be available in stores nationwide. Negotiations are also in the works for another local coffee shop to sell these "LIFE Jackets."

The Maliki Mums sewing project has empowered women, strengthened families and changed the minds of those who ignore the most vulnerable in Kenyan society: children with disabilities. No longer are these children kept hidden in their homes. Now the Mums have skills that enable them to provide for their families, and they are admired and respected in their community. Plans have just begun to travel back to Kenya in 2012. The women want to learn more sewing projects. This is a trip of a lifetime that will literally change you. The Maliki (Angel) Mums are so proud to wear their yellow uniforms. They all have disabled kids that the CTC works with to educate them for a better life. In addition to the projects mentioned by Denise, the Mums learned to make burp cloths, rag dolls and tea towels. These projects used hand stitching, but the Mums also learned to use both the treadle machine and electric machines. It was very rewarding to see the excitement that these ladies had for learning how to sew. They were so eager and tried so hard to get it right. They worked on each project until it was done then went home and used them that night with pride in their accomplishment.

Whole foods have commissioned them to make 30,000 more of the LIFE

Jackets and also are selling Tote bags that the Mums are making and they get the profits from these sales. Denise designed a shoulder bag for another group that they are hoping to get a commission to make. Four of them were put together and this group was very happy with the end product.



One of the Mums got to put her daughter into public school this year, the first child of these mums to do this as children can't go to school if the parents can't afford to buy them a uniform.

We did get to buy them 4 more Electric Commercial Sewing machines from contributions that had been raised so all 9 original Mums now have an electric machine. However, they don't always have electricity so the next project is to get a generator that will work for them to keep them sewing.


