

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

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### Community Service Report

So we thought we had done plenty of charity sewing in the first half of the year and would take a break, but apparently the community didn't get the memo. A request from the Children's Home for vinyl table cloths to protect some tables that were donated resulted in Theresa, Vicky (and Theresa's "honorary" helper) taking over the new work room at A-1 Singer one afternoon to made six round table cloths with elastic edges to hold them on. Three more will be needed when additional vinyl is available.

Derby Neighborhood group changed their June meeting to a day-time sewing day where seven dedicated members produced 12 receiving blankets, 9 double thickness receiving blankets, 5 baby quilts and 4 lap robes.

At the May 5<sup>th</sup> Tuesday Sew-in, members of the Serger Neighborhood group used the "blanket

stitch" on their sergers to produce ten baby blankets for the fall baby shower. Other members honed their skills at attaching double fold bias tape to turn out 30 "coffee cup tool organizers" to present to the 4-H style review participants.

As a side project, Theresa also sewed up 29 chairback pockets at the request of a local kindergarten teacher.

On June 29<sup>th</sup>, about six of our members joined over 200 volunteers and law enforcement officers at the Extension Center to participate in Bears for Badges. Some of our member also made bears at home. 445 bears were cut, sewn, turned, applied with eyes and noses, stuffed, stitched up and beribboned between 9 am and midnight. Theresa (with Vicky in the background sewing, and a couple of other member cameos) got interviewed by Channel 12 and appeared on the 5 and 6 o'clock news that day. There is a story and video on <a href="www.kwch.com/news">www.kwch.com/news</a> (not sure how long this will be available). Vicky also has a DVD copy. Denise Dias, who organized the event, intends to do it again next year.

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To round things off, Sew Inspired Neighborhood Group spent a couple of their meetings learning to pleat and smock and have stitched up nine Wee Care gowns.




