Rumour Has It...





The Wichita Chapter of the American Sewing Guild is pleased to announce that Linda Lee, an internationally recognized designer, speaker, author and nationally known teacher, will present a trunk show Thursday evening, April 18, followed by a two-day sewing workshop April 19 and 20, 2013.

Linda Lee's career straddles two industries – interior design and fashion and sewing. She owns the sewingworkshop.com website for fashion sewing enthusiasts. She also is the owner of The Sewing Workshop Pattern Collection, a group of patterns for distinctive garments using innovative sewing techniques. Linda writes for *Threads*, *Sew News* and *Stitch* magazines. She travels the country teaching fine sewing techniques and the art of combining beautiful fabrics and distinctive design in garment and home decorating creations. Using her background as a licensed interior designer and a member of ASID since 1974, she has written fourteen books relating to garment sewing and interiors. *Sew Sensational Pillows* won the Independent Book Award in the Craft and Hobby Category and *Sew Easy* won Honorable mention by the Independent Publisher Book Awards for Most Original Design in their *Ten Outstanding Books of the Year* awards. Linda started with making and selling felt hats in 6th grade. Linda's business ventures have followed – from a life-long career in interior design to producing avant-garde sewing patterns for the adventurous sewer. One pillow-making project ultimately led to fourteen books, television appearances on HGTV and traveling and teaching the fine art of combining beautiful fabrics and innovative sewing techniques for both garments and interiors.

A free trunk show on Thursday evening, April 18, at 7:00 PM, will be followed by a two-day hands on workshop, April 19th and 20th, 9:00 AM to 4:30 PM. We will be working with Linda's pattern for her Ikina Jacket; it is a below-waist jacket. It has open sides finished with kimono-like facings, bias-cut, one-piece collar/band, three-quarter length sleeves and deep hems. You may view the pattern at sewingworkshop.com. The kimono facing can be optional, if desired. Linda will teach different variations of this pattern and techniques for working with silk.

The cost for the workshop is \$100.00 for ASG members and \$110.00 for non-members. Lunch is included on Friday and Saturday. You will be responsible for bringing you own supplies for the workshop, including your sewing machine with extension cord, fabric, pattern and basic sewing supplies. We will have the pattern available at the February and March general meetings. Linda has discounted the pattern to us for \$18.00. (A \$5.00 savings)

Fabric kits will be available at the trunk show including her silks; the kits are \$79.00 and include fabric, thread, and a selection of silks to piece. There will be additional fabrics and other sewing items for sale at the trunk show on Thursday.

You are responsible for bringing you own supplies for the workshop, including your sewing machine with extension cord, basic sewing supplies, fabric and pattern. (Patterns will be available from Wichita ASG in advance for \$18.00. (A \$5.00 savings) You may use your own fabric or purchase a kit from Linda Lee on Thursday.

Registration Deadline is April 12, 2013

In the Library

Items in our library include books, videos, DVDs, magazines and patterns. These items may be checked out for one month at a time. DVDs and videos must be returned the following month and may not be renewed until the end of the meeting so that others have a chance to check them out.

There is a charge of \$1 <u>per item per month</u> for items returned late. Any item not returned within 6 months will be considered lost and the member will be responsible for replacing it. A complete listing of library holdings is available at the library table during our monthly meetings.

Ginny has ordered *five new books* that she expects to be available by February, so be sure to stop by the Library table and see what she has.

We are also happy to receive your donations of sewing related magazines that we then sell to other members. However, we request that you limit your donations to no more than two years worth at one time, so that our librarian can handle the volume.
