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

How to Enter Your T-shirt in the Kansas State Fair

You can enter on-line or on paper. To get a paper entry form, ask for the 4-H office at the Sedgwick County Extension Center. They have forms and a list of categories for Domestic Arts. You can also print the form online, but if you are already there, why not enter online as follows?!

- 1. Go to the address: www.kansasstatefair.com
- Mouse over "Competitions" in the banner to see a drop down. Click on LOGIN-CREAT ACCOUNT.
- 3. If you already have an account, log in. You will be taken to the Competitions page. You will need to click on "Update Exhibitor Profile & W-9" on the right. Check your information, then scroll down and fill the dot to complete the W-9. Click on the

- "Update Account" box. Choose "Individual/Sole proprietor" and fill in your Social Security Number. Check the "I Certify" box and click "Submit". Skip to step 5.
- 4. If you don't have an account, click on "Create an Account". Fill in the information and fill the dot to complete the W-9 at the bottom. Click on the "Update Account" box. Choose "Individual/Sole proprietor" and fill in your Social Security Number. Check the "I Certify" box and click "Submit".
- 5. You will be taken back to the Competitions page. (If not, mouse over "Competitions" and choose "Exhibitor Handbook"). Scroll down and click on "Clothing and Textiles".
- 6. Scroll down (read the rules) until you find the class you want. The ASG sponsored class is called "Creative Fashion T-shirt Challenge". Click on "REGISTER NOW" button. If you don't see it, scroll up and log in.
- 7. Click on 'FINISH THIS ENTRY". You will see a listing of your entry. If you wish to enter more classes, click on "Add another entry" at the top of the list.



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
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click on "Check Out" button. You can delete any entries you don't want at this stage.

- 9. Scroll down and click on "Go to Step 2". You will get a summary of your entry fees, which should be \$0.00, unless you are entering after August 15. Now click "Finalize Registration". Print or save a copy of your list of entries. You can also print an extra copy of the list and cut it up to attach to your individual entries. This will help get the right entry tags on when your items are taken to the Fair.
- You can login again and make more entries or review your list at any time.
- 11. Now get sewing. Good Luck!



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On-Going Fundraisers

Thanks to Needle Nook Fabrics for donating a number of back issues of Sew Stylish Magazine.

Most fabric is sold at \$1 per yard, but there are some high quality quilt cottons priced a little higher.

<u>Now sold from the Fabric Fund tables</u>: Patterns and magazines that have been donated by members are for sale for 25 cents each or 5 for a dollar. Funds raised go to buy items for the library and some of our other activities. Happy shopping!

Tables open before and after the meeting and during refreshment break.

In the Library

Items in our library include books, videos, DVDs, magazines and patterns. These items may be checked out for one month at a time. DVDs and videos must be returned the following month and may not be renewed until the end of the meeting so that others have a chance to check them out.

There is a charge of \$1 **per item per month** for items returned late. Any item not returned within 6 months will be considered lost and the member will be responsible for



replacing it. A complete listing of library holdings is available at the library table during our monthly meetings.

We are also happy to receive your donations of sewing related magazines that we then sell to other members. However, we request that you limit your donations to no more than two years worth at one time, so that our librarian can handle the volume.

New in the Library:

• <u>The Unofficial Downton Abbey Sews</u>, (special edition magazine) from the editors of *Stitch* Magazine, Interweave, 128 pp, 2014.

Review: The Unofficial Downton Abbey Sews

This magazine contains 43 projects inspired by the clothing, accessories and decor of the PBS series Downton Abbey. The clothing is not exact replicas of costumes from the show, but instead has been adapted to be wearable for today. One pattern is included for the "Let's Do Lunch Topper" (hat). The remainder of the patterns are downloadable in up to nine sizes. You have to create a log-in account in order to get them, but there is no extra charge. The patterns print out in a tile format that must be taped together. All the instructions are in the magazine. A copy will be available in the library, or to buy your own, go to www.sewdaily.com and click on "Shop". (I got my copy at Barnes & Noble, but didn't see any more available last week.)

Community Service Report

Fourteen soft, fuzzy blankets made from fabric donated by Needle Nook Fabrics have been taken to the Children's home. Contact Theresa Corle (see p. 2) for size information if you wish to make some small blankets.

MEOW Neighborhood Group has decided to have another "Donations Challenge" in October. It was thought that the charities could use another influx of items just before the holidays. Items needed for Harbor House are anything a woman would need to re-establish her household. These items are for women, often with children, who are re-starting their lives after escaping domestic abuse. Blankets, quilts and pillow cases may also be made for Victory in the Valley, which helps women undergoing cancer
