


Rumour Has It...




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Community Service Report

An article in the Wichita Eagle a few weeks ago has prompted Theresa and her side kick to find out more about Dress a Girl International. This organization provides simple dresses to girls and drawstring shorts to boys who may never have had a new garment. They provide the patterns and the only requirement for the fabric is that it not be see-through. They also have a label that is prominent on the outside of the garment. This label shows predators that the child is cared for and helps prevent them being forced into the sex trade.

Two Day Workshop Apríl 11 & 12, 2014

Sedgwick County Extension Center, 21st St. N & Ridge Road, Wichita, KS

Presented by the Wichita Chapter of the American Sewing Guild

Gail Yellen of Gail Patrice Design teaches sewing and serger technique classes, garment construction and embellishment workshops. Chock full of valuable ideas and information for garment, quilt and home décor sewers, her classes are geared to all levels of sewing skills. Gail particularly loves to teach embellishment techniques that can transform the most basic garments into art-to-wear.

She is an active member of the American Sewing Guild CT Chapter and has moderated the Manchester Neighborhood Group's activities for over 10 years

Friday, April 11, 9 am to 4pm: It's All About Embellishment

The right embellishment can make any sewing project go from mundane to marvelous! And the best part is, you can create exquisite embellishments using

a very basic zigzag-capable sewing machine. Appliqué, reverse appliqué, "windows," shrink thread, 2 different "Un-Beweavable" techniques, cool button stacking combos and couching–we'll experiment with all of them.

<u>Participants should bring</u>: Sewing machine, all accessories and feet, instruction manual, 2 spools beige thread, 2 bobbins, extra spool pin, extra machine needles (size 80/12 or 90/14), basic sewing supplies. Kit fee: \$23 (to be paid to Gail Yellen at the workshop)

Saturday, April 12, 9 am to 4 pm: Cosmetic Serger-y Workshop

What is Cosmetic Serger-y? It's the blending of construction and decorative serger techniques. While the serger is traditionally used for finishing edges, it can also be an important embellishment tool. Whether you're a new serger owner or have been using one for years, you'll learn some very cool techniques that will add a whole new dimension to your garment, home décor or quilt projects. We'll explore the wide variety of decorative threads to create decorative stitches and take your artistry to a whole new level. Create braid trim and embellished elastic button loops with your serger. Leave with a workbook loaded with valuable information, samples and the inspiration to tackle any decorative serger technique successfully. Participants must be familiar with threading and changing needles on their machine.

<u>Participants should bring:</u> Serger, all accessories and feet, serger thread, instruction manual, extra machine needles. Kit Fee: \$24 (to be paid to Gail Yellen at the workshop)


