I was so happy to see 9 returning volunteers and we picked up 3 new ones this year, so we had 12 people working their tails off for a few hours. I want to add that our two newest members Jan Tuinstra and Diane Scanlan joined us and since Sondra Schmittgens retired, she finally got in on the fun. The last time we heard from the organizers, there were over 325 students at the event which was down from last year. We assisted 32 of them with 42 different alterations. Those we were in contact with represented 20 schools. Last year's scrap gowns were used to make multiple bags for this year and luckily, we salvaged the straps from many of them and added them to several strapless dresses. The girls were elated to have them added because the strapless look was foreign and/or uncomfortable for them (hooray for modesty). One young lady remembered Ronda Voorhis from last year when she had altered her brother's pants, so they had a little mini reunion on the spot. This year there seemed to be more men's suits available, so we encountered more guys getting pants shortened. ASG passed out 21 bags, 15 wraps and 5 bow ties. If you have never been a part of this endeavor, please try us next year because chances are you will like it and be hooked, it really is a lot of fun.

We spend a lot of time going to sales, auctions, store close-outs and other places looking for fabrics, patterns and notions.




