Sewing's a Brees....

At the May general meeting the round table discussion came from a question asked by the Chapter Advisory Board (CAB). The question was: "What technique do you avoid when sewing – what causes you the most problem

or issue?" Would it surprise you to find that six of the seven tables listed buttonholes? (One of those listed bound buttonholes). I was, as most of the machines now days have built in buttonhole stitches which leads me to think either we all have incredibly old machines (I know that's not true) or that we forgot what we learned when we learned how to use our last purchased machine.



The second most often mentioned technique was invisible zippers. One did mention just zippers and one mentioned fly fronts so I'm assuming that included putting in a zipper. You probably know that fabric stores sell feet that you can use to install an invisible zipper. If you are like me, good luck finding it when you need it! Did you know you can install an invisible zipper without a special invisible foot?

Welt pockets along with bound buttonholes were mentioned. Did you know on the asg.org web site there are directions for in the hoop welt pockets? Access it by going to the web site, sign in then go to education, select sewing & embroidery video & projects, select Machine embroidery projects and scroll down to ITH welt pockets.

Another technique mentioned was shirt front placket. In our own ASG library there is a video by Louise Cutting that has a very good tutorial on doing a shirt front placket.

Others mentioned (in no particular order): stitch in the ditch, matching plaids, set in sleeves, accurate measuring/cutting, perfection, hand work, threading a needle, darts (always pucker), knits, rolled hem, and bias tape binding.

It looks to me like we have a lot of programs to choose from. Let me know what you think.

Have you ever wondered, am I a hoarder when it comes to fabric? Just because we appreciate almost all fabric; and get a special high when we see and touch it. (one reason I think it would be hard to buy fabric on line.) I really don't think so.

We do let go of fabric from time to time. Where do you think the fabric fund comes from? We check our stash for charity sews. A fat quarter can become a baby bib. Four fat quarters can become a baby blanket. Sometimes you have that special piece of fabric that you have no idea what it will become. It just makes you feel good.

Years ago when I first started sewing, my mom said "if you ever see some fabric you want, buy it NOW, because it won't be there when you go back". She shopped at TG&Y, Woolworth, and Otasco. She was speaking from experience.

Well, I feel much better after writing this. Give yourself permission to buy some fabric, but also give yourself permission to let go of it. We do not have to keep everything.

Leggings, they are everywhere! Easy to make and fun to wear! Options are endless!

Any legging pattern will work, I use Kwik Sew K4044. It has no side seam which makes them super fast to sew up. I also use the leggings fabric to make a waistband instead of adding elastic. Add a cuff at the bottom of the legs and these can be complete on a serger in a matter of minutes. I have also used the blind hem foot for my serger to hem them.

Fabric recommended is for two way stretch with 75% stretch. This pattern calls for 1 yard.

Pair up leggings with a tunic top and you are ready to go. They make great sleep pants or wear them to the gym for a work-out.
