Does it Work?

Using a UV Light While Sewing!







Have you ever struggled when you are sewing white-on-white fabric? Do I have a solution for you! Get a small UV Light (#1) and light it on both sides of the material. #2 Shows how it appears on the wrong side of the material. #3 shows you that it is the right side of the material. This trick is such a time saver when using a lot of pieces of white on white. Happy Sewing.

All of his medical care is conducted at the transplant center in Dallas Texas. I never know when his weekly (local) lab results might reveal some type of variance that requires him in Dallas for further testing or even a hospital stay for treatment.

So, we remain 1/2 packed and mentally "ready to go".

I'm grateful that fabric doesn't have and expiration date!!

My craft/sewing room is packed with UFOs, but I still seem to drag home more in hopes of calmer days spent creating.

My little black pug, "Gracie Jane" is my shadow and faithful sewing assistant. I am so glad she cannot repeat some of the "colorful language" she has witnessed. She and the Bassett, Hank, fight over the dog bed in the sewing room, where plenty of "doggie politics" take place.

I am motivated to learn and tackle all things sewing as my oldest granddaughter shows interest in learning and wants me to teach her.

Obviously, she is much more wise than I.

I cannot thank all of you enough for accepting me, taking me under your wings and having patience with me. I have made some unforgettable and cherished friendships through ASG and look forward to making more.
